




Smart Justice in the Heart of the Kimberley

Through Olabud Doogethu's efforts, we have seen massive improvements in creating a safer Halls Creek:

in arrests made
(aged 10-14), 2017-20

referred to Juvenile Justice
Team (aged 10-17), 2018-20

-64%

number of Aboriginal persons
admitted to police custody
(aged 10+), 2018-20

in motor vehicles thefts
(aged 10-17), 2017-20
